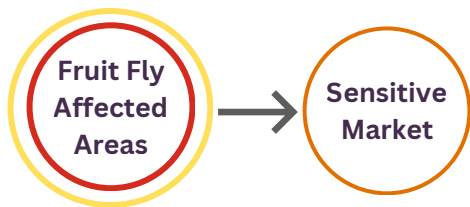


Moving host produce from Adelaide Hills fruit fly outbreak zones

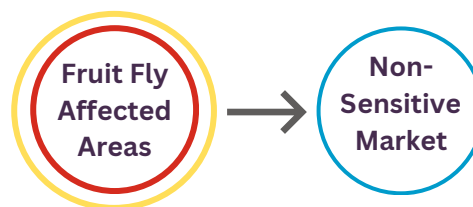
from Fruit Fly Affected Areas to a Sensitive Market

What you need to do

- Apply fruit fly treatment in line with **Plant Quarantine Standards (PQS)**.
- Consignments must be transported under secure conditions.

Forms you need and the process

- Contact PIRSA to arrange an inspection and issue certification of secure transport.
- Submit a Secure Movement Notification form 48 hrs before produce is moved.
- **IDC or DCIMC**
- **PHAC**



from Fruit Fly Affected Areas to a Non-Sensitive Market

What you need to do

- Fruit fly treatment isn't required.
- Consignments must be transported under secure conditions.

Forms you need and the process

- Contact PIRSA to arrange an inspection and issue certification of secure transport.
- Submit a Secure Movement Notification form 48 hrs before produce is moved.
- **DCIMC**

Glossary

- **CIMC** - Chief Inspector's Movement Certificate
- **DCIMC** - Deputy Chief Inspector's Movement Certificate
- **IDC** - Inspector Direction Certificate
- **PHAC** - Plant Health Assurance Certificate
- **Non-Sensitive Market** - Includes VIC, NSW, QLD and NT (excludes Ti Tree in NT)
- **Sensitive Market** - Includes SA, WA, Tas and Ti Tree in NT
- **Movement under secure conditions** - secure means fully enclosed or screened with no gaps larger than 1.6 mm in diameter
